

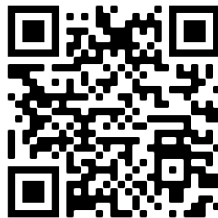
# How to make your Christingle



1. Cut a small cross into the top of the orange.
2. Place a square of tin foil over it (to catch the candle wax as it drops).
3. Place the candle on top of the foil and push it firmly into the orange.
4. Load a mixture of dried fruit and sweets on to the cocktail sticks, ensuring the points are covered.
5. Insert the sticks around the base of the candle.
6. Store upright in a cool place.

*Don't make them too far in advance, as they don't keep for very long.*

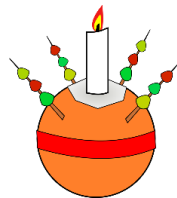
## What does the Christingle Mean?

Christingle means 'Christ - light':

- The orange represents the world;
- The four cocktail sticks represent the seasons;
- The dried fruit and sweets show God's love in providing food;
- The red ribbon reminds us that Jesus came to rescue us by dying for us;
- And the lighted candle reminds us that Jesus is the Light of the World.

*Once you've made your Christingle, you might like to say the following prayer:*

Father God,  
Thank you that you have given us the beautiful world around us.  
Thank you for the way you love us and care for us.  
Thank you that Jesus was born on that first Christmas to rescue us.  
Please help us to welcome in the light of Jesus this Christmas.  
Amen.
